## Directors' Corner:

#### Hurricane Irma:

Irma was the worst tropical storm in many years to hit our community. Considering the intense high winds, we had minimal property damage reported so far. One of the shuffleboard awnings was destroyed. Two awnings were destroyed, one flat roof was damaged and several tree limbs were down. Also, the front sign was damaged.

The board of directors that were here did the best they could preparing for the storm. Clubhouse pool and patio furniture were moved indoors. Garbage containers were brought inside.

We also went around the community looking for objects that could become airborne and had them removed. We found that many seasonal residents as well as those who left before the storm didn't remove objects that should have been brought inside.

For most of us, the worst was the four days with no electricity and the lack of garbage collection for nine days.

A day after the storm approximately 20% of our residents had electricity, all of Rosewood Court, west side of Sandalwood Court, northwest side of Magnolia Trail (*from Heatherglen to the school yard*) and all of Palm Crest Court, and the clubhouse.

During the four days without power, many residents utilized the clubhouse, cooking meals, preparing coffee and snacks for those who had no power.

Power outages throughout Pinellas County caused the sewer relay stations to be offline. Which put our sewer system in jeopardy of backing up into our homes. To keep this from happening, two manhole covers were opened to relieve pressure until the County had their sewer relay stations back on line.

Directors and residents were in contact with the city regarding garbage pick-up. We all were told that the garbage would be picked up that day. Even going down to city hall in person didn't help. Finally, on Friday we were told that we had to wait until our normal pick-up day on Saturday. On a positive note, they did come earlier than normal on Saturday.


